

## The Season of Divine Visitation

*“Thou shalt arise, and have mercy upon Zion: for the time to favour her, yea, the set time is come.”*

*Psalm 102:13*

Genesis 19:29 says, “God remembered Abraham...” This gives the impression as if the all-knowing God would forget something or someone. This is not possible. Until the appointed day of your favour, God remembers to send His salvation as He did remove the woes of Lot. Genesis 30:22 says “And God remembered Rachel...” From Rachel’s experience, when your time of favour comes, long standing problems suddenly resolved.

No problem can resist the power of God’s favour. This has not changed in time. God’s favour is known to deal with reproaches in a man’s life or family. Rachel’s reproach was barrenness. Naaman’s reproach was leprosy. The prophet’s widow was plagued with heavy indebtedness. Yet divine favour took away all their reproaches. What is that reproach in your life today? It will be taken care of by God’s favour.

“And God heard their groaning, and God remembered His covenant with Abraham, with Isaac, and with Jacob.” (Exo 2:24) For over 400 years, God’s people suffered much hardship in Egypt. Generation after generation the Jewish people were on slavery, poverty and bondage. Meanwhile, it appeared God had forgotten that He had a covenant with Abraham His friend.

But when the time of their favour was at hand, God remembered His covenant with their ancestors and delivered them through Moses (Exo 7:16). The set time of favour is the *kairos* season of divine visitation. In 1 Samuel 2:21, God visited Hannah and her years of barrenness were overtaken by years of fruitfulness.

When God visited Hannah, it was at home, not in Shiloh. At times, when God hears your cries at special meeting, He may have dispatched His angels to personally deliver your ‘package’ to you at home. Distance is not a barrier. This season, the Lord will visit you even at your location and turn your reproach around.

Put God in remembrance of His mercy (Ps 51:1; Lam 3:22-23) and your season of divine uplifting shall come: “...and exalted them of low degree. He hath filled the hungry with good things...in remembrance of His mercy.” (Lk 1:52-54) Ponder over the passage of Psalm 103 and 136 and magnify His wondrous mercy (Ps 145:8-9; 89:1-2). For mercy precedes favour. (Ps 89: 28,29)
