

The Grand Secret of Fruitful Living

“One thing I have desired of the Lord,....”

(Ps 27:4)

One of the greatest wisdom to living effectually on earth is expressing the insightful understanding of the principle and power of priorities. Life on earth often seem to be a rat race, busy cruising between compelling alternatives-alternators ever demanding our limited time. Our life is the sum total of all the daily decisions and those decisions are determined by our priorities. Life becomes powerful and influential by the principle of prioritization.

Priority is defined as the establishment of the pursuit of the principal thing. It is the focus of putting first things first. The core lesson of Psalm 27:4 is simply keeping the main thing as the main thing! Don't shift your focus. It is a choice of placing noblest worth and highest value upon the prized treasure of our heart. Our priorities rule and dictate all our conducts and determine the significance and quality of life.

The greatest tragedy in life is not living a brief lifespan but life without a noble cause or valued purposes. Simply, a life with the wrong priorities. In that sense, life's greatest failure is to be successful in the wrong assignment. Success lies in the wise stewardship of time. For your time is your life. The key to time management is the effective management of right priorities. The thumb rule: first things first! Priority is the essence of a meaningful and fruitful life.

Ponder Jesus' remark: “But one thing is needed and Mary has chosen that good part, which will not be taken away from her.” (Lk 10:42). Mary has chosen that best priority in the prayer investment of her time: “Mary who also sat at Jesus' feet and heard His word.” (v.39) Mary understood the principle of Psalm 138:2. You are what you are today greatly shaped by your priorities! When we seek His kingdom via His word intentionally & fervently, the living word shall impart wisdom and favour into our destiny and thus fulfilling all of our divine assignments before leaving earth.
